08 December 2014 Government & Industry Liaison Report

A. Canadian Coast Guard Update

Cape Mudge Range Light Obstruction – CCG has advised that a regional agreement to resolve this long outstanding problem has been achieved. The solution will involve a new additional shore-based sector light that will work together with the sectored portion of the main light to provide the appropriate coverage. Final design is underway and property negotiation for land use and power access will begin soon.

Deas Island Inbound Ranges – CCG is conducting some tree trimming in the area to enhance lines of sight.

Annis Island – CCG is circulating a Notice for Comment regarding discontinuing the light at Annis Island. Reports indicate that it is rarely used and is interfering with tie up lines at the dock.

B. Canadian Hydrographic Service Update

Tide and Current Modelling – Work is underway at Kitimat, Prince Rupert, Nanaimo and Vancouver to improve tide and current predictions at these locations.

Haida Gwaii National Park – CHS and Parks Canada are commencing plans for updating hydrographic surveys in the area as existing chart data is sparse and dated.

The update program, in addition to providing more reliable data for mariners, will also enhance area's emergency response capabilities.

CHS is currently conducting extensive GPS work to reassess the accuracy of benchmarks (elevation reference points) in the area. As a result of last year's Haida Gwaii earthquake, most of the east side of Haida Gwaii is now 20 cm lower than it was; whereas, the west side has dropped close to one meter.

C. BC Ferries Update

The new Denman Island cable ferry is under construction; projected in-service date is June 15, 2015.

D. Vancouver – Fraser Port Authority Update

The Port Authority is currently addressing the concerns of the BC Coast Pilots with regard to the adequacy of the Port's dock and fendering facilities. Existing docks/berths have been designed and built for ships up to 265 metres in length while some of the newer container ships now coming into the port are up to 350 metres in length. This can cut ship spacing down to as little as 6 to 14 metres and place extraordinary loads on the dock fenders thereby creating potentially dangerous situations.

VFPA has a new Harbour Master. Natalie Anderson has taken over from Chris Wellstood. Natalie will be assuming duties related to port operations while Chris will be involved with regulatory matters.



January 26, 2015 VANCOUVER, BC –

The 53rd annual Vancouver International Boat Show closed on Sunday, January 25, with many exhibitors generating strong onsite sales and leads over the course of the five-day Show. The combination of historically low interest rates and the sharp decline in the price

of fuel have resulted in a positive start to the year's sales and have positioned Western Canada's boating industry for an optimistic 2015.

With BC Place hosting the indoor venue, and Granville Island providing a historic maritime setting for the Floating Show, the 2015 Boat Show offered exhibitors an opportunity to kick-start the coming boating season, and showcase new model year products, accessories and services to consumers.

"It's been the best Show ever," said Salim Ladha from Steveston Marine. "The crowds on the weekend have been very strong, with the rain driving people inside to BC Place. Our sales this year were unprecedented, and up significantly compared to the last two years."

"This Show has been great for us," said Sharon Ross at Performance Water Sport. "The people we saw coming our this year were serious boaters looking to make a purchase and the weekend was busier than normal, especially on Sunday. Not only are our sales up from the last two years, but we are also confident that we'll have a lot of follow up in the weeks to come."

"The sales at this year's Show were unprecedented and well exceeded our expectations," noted Berry Sherwood of Sherwood Marina. "While the traffic was a bit slower, we saw a big increase in the quality of customers. The promotion leading up to the Show was really well done and we had a lot of people coming into our dealership with inquiries in the weeks prior to opening day."

Mike Hudson of Port Boat House also remarked on the quality of consumers that attended the Show. "We really noticed an increase in qualified, knowledgeable customers and a shift to a younger demographic. We were satisfied with the level of traffic and our sales equaled to last year's so we are happy with that!"

While the rainy weather was a deterrent for attendance at the Floating

Show, the exhibitors at Granville Island were also pleased with the quality of visitors.

"Overall it's been a successful Show for us," said David Campbell from Freedom Marine. "Though the weather wasn't on our side for the majority of



"This year's features and seminar program were instrumental in driving strong media coverage, and Wicked Tuna's Dave Carraro helped reach a younger demographic of boating enthusiasts." says Show Manager Eric Nicholl. "We were pleased with the effectiveness of this year's marketing strategies. Even though attendance figures were lower than last year, mostly due to adverse weather conditions at the Floating Show, most dealers are reporting strong sales due to the high numbers of motivated buyers."

29,665 people visited the two venues during the five - day event, a 5 % decrease from the previous year. The Show continues to see increasing attendance from the Asian community as a result of marketing efforts

targeting this demographic's interest in boating. Wilson Kao's "What a beautiful BC boating life! Let's buy a boat" seminar in Mandarin was a big draw for Chinese Show goers, and his knowledge on boating trends specific to the Asian market continue s to garner media interest. A certified boating instructor and local yacht salesman, Kao offers years of experience and a wealth of knowledge about BC's boating market. Dates for the 54th Vancouver International Boat Show are scheduled for January 20-24, 2016 at BC Place and Granville Island. Western



For The Love of Salmon





Salmon and Dill Frittata

Serves 4

Ingredients:

- 2 big leeks, sliced lengthwise and cut into half moons
- 6 eggs
- Splash of 1% milk
- 2 tbsp of chopped dill
- 2 oz. smoked salmon, cut into thin strips
- Cooking spray
- Salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

Pre-heat oven to 400.

Coat a 10-inch non-stick sauté pan with cooking spray and heat over a medium flame. Add leeks and sauté for about ten minutes or until translucent and tender.

In the meantime, combine eggs, egg whites, milk, salt and pepper in a large bowl. Whisk well before stirring in the dill and salmon.

Pour egg mixture into sauté pan with the leeks and asparagus. Pop it all into the oven for 20 minutes and enjoy!!

Lox & Cream Cheese Bagels

Lox is a fillet of brined salmon.
Traditionally, lox is served on a bagel with cream

cheese, and is usually garnished with tomato, sliced red onion, and sometimes capers.

BBQ Salmon With Lemon

Rinse salmon fillet under cold running water and pat dry. Cut a piece of foil long and wide enough to encase the salmon


when folded over the center and folded up on the ends. Position the foil on a large baking sheet and place the salmon in the center of the foil, skin side down. Sprinkle the salmon with the salt, pepper, and rosemary. Place the lemon slices over the fish fillet along with the sliced onion and garlic slivers. Drizzle the fillet evenly with the olive oil and fold the edges

of the foil up over the salmon and crimp to seal. Fold the edges together on both ends to create an airtight package.

Bake the salmon for 15 minutes, or until just cooked through but still moist. Serve immediately, using a large metal spatula to portion fish.

Accompany with rice, seasonal vegetables, and/or green salad, and a glass of lighter bodied stone fruit flavoured white wine or light and fruity red wine. Spoon some of the accumulated juices over the fish.
