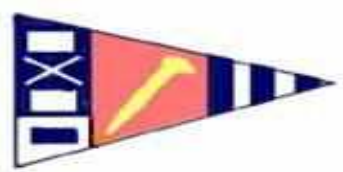

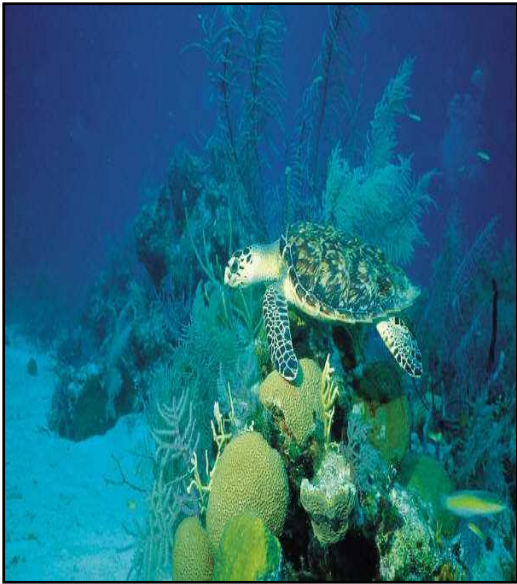

Good news for those boaters that love Gorge Harbour

In the May 2010 Boat Journal, in October 2009 an oyster lease expansion application was filed which covered approximately 40 acres and threatened the Marina and the surrounding waterfront for home owners. For boaters it would have eliminated one of the most popular anchorages on Cortes. After considerable public outcry from locals as well as boaters the license was denied.

Happily the newly updated Marina at Gorge Harbour can be enjoyed by all boaters now and in the future and goes to show that public outcry works.
